When God Moves

(Acts 7:44-60)

Group Interaction & Application

Read aloud Acts 7:44-60.

What words, phrases, concepts, or images from these verses stand out to you as you just read them, or create curiosity for you in some way?

What aspects of Pastor KJ's message gave you fresh insight into this passage, or helped you the most in understanding these verses and what we experience here?

When, if ever, have you clung so tightly to a good (existing) thing that you missed potentially an even better thing?

Stephen pointed out to his audience that while the tabernacle was always on the move, the temple stayed in one place. (vs. 44-47)

Where have you potentially unknowingly contained God?

Conversely, when have you been open to moving with God wherever He leads?

Where, if anywhere, might you be clinging to a past form of engagement with God that could be hindering your present engagement with Him?

Stephen quoted Isaiah 66 pointing out that God does not need a temple. (vs. 48-50)

If there are any traditions or potential areas of misplaced reverence in your life that could be hindering God's movement in your life, what might these be?

Stephen described his listeners as "stiff-necked people... who resisted the Holy Spirit." (vs. 51)

How responsive are you to the Spirit's prompting in your own life?

When have you followed a prompting well and what was the outcome of this obedience?

When have you resisted and what was the outcome of this resistance?

Within this portion of Scripture, Luke points out that Saul was witnessing these events – showing that God is at work in the bleakest moments. (vs. 58)

Where, if anywhere, might you feel discouraged or a bit hopeless now?

Where are you seeing God move in this present place or where have you seen Him move when you have been in dark places in the past?

As Stephen is being stoned, we read that he saw a vision of Jesus standing. (vs. 55)

Why might this vision have been so powerful to Stephen?

What can this vision mean for us?

Where is God calling you to move today?

Conclude by praying for one another in taking practical next steps in applying this weekend's message and group discussion, after which pray for group needs and concerns.
